- Who would you like to play with at recess that you’ve never played with before?
- Tell me something good that happened today.
- What word did your teacher say most today?
- What do you think you should do/learn more of at school?
- Who in your class do you think you could be nicer to?
- Where do you play the most at recess?
- Who is the funniest person in your class? Why is he/she so funny?
- What was your favorite part of lunch?
- If you got to be the teacher tomorrow, what would you do?
- If you could switch seats with anyone in the class, who would you trade with? Why?
- Tell me about three different times you used your pencil today at school.
- Are any of your classmates having a hard time? If yes, how can you help him/her?
- What is your favorite piece of recess equipment?
- Did you notice anything cool in anyone else’s lunch today?
- What is one way you showed responsibility today?
- Name one way you showed respect today.
- Did you lead any activities at school today?
- Did you give anyone a compliment today? Did anyone give you one?
